Growth Circle 9:00 am	Community Circle & Centering: Students do a rooting exercise and engage in socratic dialogue on intriguing topics and recent events, nurturing critical thinking and collaboration.
Tender Shoots 9:20 am	Academic Block 1: Explore core subjects with hands-on indoor and outdoor learning labs, fostering growth and exploration.
Village Rooting 11:00 am	SEL Check–In: Cultivate empathy, resilience, and emotional growth through interactive exercises and group discussions.
Noon Harvest 12:00 pm	Lunch and Recess: Nourish body and spirit with a communal meal and outdoor play.
Afternoon Blossom 1: 15 pm	Academic Block 2: Further exploration in humanities or occupations, nurturing inquiry and understanding.
Budding Creativity 2:30 pm	Enrichment Activity: Spark creativity through storytelling workshops, planting seeds of imagination.
Sunset Reap 3:15–3:30 pm	Closing circle for gratitude and reflection and restoration of environment as students prepare for a restful night, ready to bloom anew.
